The Lackawanna Historical Society has chronicled the struggles and triumphs of Scranton for 120 years.

During that time, the organization has collected thousands of photographs, books, maps and newspapers, as well as antique furnishings, art, tools and fashions. In conjunction with the Hope Horn Gallery at the University of Scranton, the society presents a new exhibit, "A History of Scranton: Selections from the Lackawanna Historical

Society Collection."The exhibit highlights Scranton's early settlement, industrial development, and community life including a remarkable 70 inch map by early city planner, Joel Amsden, published in 1857. The exhibit is accompanied by the newly released book, "Scranton," by Cheryl A. Kashuba, Darlene Miller-Lanning, and Alan Sweeney (Arcadia Publishing, 2005). The exhibit is on display from October 30 through December 16, 2005 at the Hope Horn Gallery, Hyland Hall, Fourth Floor, at the corner of Linden Street and Jefferson Avenue in Scranton. Gallery hours are Sunday through Friday, noon to 4 pm; Wednesdays from 6 to 8 pm.

Other events planned around the exhibit include a book signing of "Scranton" at the Lackawanna Historical Society (Nov. 6), a tour of the Scranton estate (Nov. 16), the Lackawanna Historical Society's Christmas Open House (Dec. 2), and a tour of the University of Scranton's Weinberg Library Heritage Room and Southey Mural (Dec. 7).
