# The Center for Anti-Slavery Studies Underground Railroad Bus Tour Series Begins

ew research shows that this region was a hotbed of Underground Railroad (UGRR) activities in the 1800s. Beginning in April, the Center for Anti-Slavery Studies and the Lackawanna Heritage Valley Authority will offer a series of heritage bus tours that travel along the very routes used by escaping slaves and staunch Abolitionists. The trips will feature narrated walking tours, living history presentations, and musical programs.

All excursions include a visit to the Center for Anti-Slavery Studies in Montrose and a tour of a 19th century UGRR settlement currently under renovations. Several trips include a walking tour of the historic Waverly Cemetery, and special July tours include a unique UGRR experience at Old Mil Village, a 19th century living history museum in New Milford, PA.

The two-day excursions also offer a welcome reception, dinner, and a special UGRR program on Saturday evening. On Sunday, these tours will explore the region's many
