Lacawac Sanctuary: A Natural and Historic Gem

ounded in 1966, Lacawac Sanctuary Foundation owns and protects 510 acres of land including

Lake Lacawac, one of the southernmost unpolluted glacial lakes in the eastern United States, and the former Connell Park, a 1903 Adirondack-style summer retreat of coal and manufacturing magnate William Connell. Located on Lake Wallenpaupack, Lacawac Sanctuary is a National Natural Landmark and historic site with a three-fold mission of research, education, and preservation.

The Sanctuary's extensive public education program for adults, children, and educators features walks, lectures, workshops, art classes, teacher training, and concerts. Upcoming events include Animal Tracking on Saturday, February 25, Spring Equinox Night Hike on Monday, March 20, and a Bluebird Nest Box Workshop on Saturday, March 25.

Lacawac Sanctuary is currently undertaking a feasibility study to explore ways to maximize the use of the Sanctuary including ecotourism activities, conferences and meetings, and

school programs. Potential partners will be identified for scientific research, ecotourism, and environmental education. The Lackawanna Heritage Valley Authority is pleased to support this important study with a Community Challenge Grant of \$5,000 funded by the National Park Service.

Lacawac Sanctuary welcomes new members and volunteers. Free tours of the Sanctuary, historic buildings, and glacial lake are offered on a regular basis from May through September. For more information, call (570) 689-9494 or visit www.lacawac.org.
