LHVA Presents \$130,000 in Grant Awards

The Lackawanna Heritage Valley Authority will host a Grant Awards Presentation on Thursday, March 23, 2006, at 2:00 pm at the Electric

City Trolley Station & Museum. Executive Director Natalie Solfanelli will present over \$130,000 in Major Partnership Grant Awards to heritage partners, and municipalities, that promote our region's rich historic, industrial, and environmental resources. Representatives from the organizations will be on hand to receive their grant award certificates.

The organizations receiving funding include:

Archbald Borough, \$35,000. To fund a Structural Assessment of the Shifting Shanty and Fan House at the historic Gravity Slope Colliery. Because similar buildings in the region have been lost

through time, preservation of this site is an important bridge to the Anthracite Era, especially its technology and labor history.

The Center for Anti-Slavery Studies, \$40,000. To support the program, "The Place I Call Home: Northeastern Pennsylvania's Underground Railroad History."This project will research and interpret an important aspect of the region's history using a traveling exhibit, a companion website and DVD, education materials, and research guides.

Countryside Conservancy, \$10,000. To improve the newly acquired nature conservation and education site, "Little Rocky Glen." This

includes installation of signs and fencing, repair of several buildings, developing a small former quarry site as a potential amphitheatre, and installing renewable energy generation for educational purposes.

Lackawanna County Coal Mine Tour, \$45,000. To develop interpretive exhibits at the soon to be constructed Orientation Center at the Lackawanna Coal Mine Tour. It also includes fabrication of exterior exhibits, maintenance facility.

LHVA receives funding from the National Park Service and the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. It offers grants and technical

assistance to nonprofit and civic organizations, heritage attractions, and municipalities to develop heritage, cultural, environmental, and community development projects.

LHVA Ambassadors, partners, and the general public are all invited to attend this event. The Electric City Trolley Station & Museum is located at 300 Cliff Street (Steamtown National Historic Site) in Scranton, PA. 

Anthracite Heritage Museum in McDade Park, Scranton. A wealth of resources to plan a successful family event will be offered. Admission is free.


