SCRANTON, PA -- Lackawanna Valley communities will be alive with the laughter of children, music playing, cheerleaders, carolers and a hearty "ho, ho, ho" as Santa and Mrs. Claus take to the rails for the annual program, "Christmas in a Small Town," on Saturday, December 3, 2005. The Santa Train, provided by Steamtown National Historic Site, in Scranton, is the key feature to these celebrations taking place at the Heritage Valley Station Stops in Carbondale, Archbald, Jessup, Olyphant and Dickson City.

The "Santa Train" will breeze in from the North Pole, carrying special guests, including Mr. and Mrs. Claus, to each station stop where they meet the gathered groups of people waiting to show Santa the best their town has to offer. Each town produces its own Christmas program, showing the unique nature of the community. Entertainment usually lasts 15- 20 minutes before the crowd takes Santa to a celebration, and the train heads to the next stop. By the time the train arrives in the next town, Santa is ready to be greeted again by another group of holiday well-wishers.

All County residents will receive an automatic 20 percent off regular retail priced ski services including lift tickets, equipment rentals, ski lessons and season passes. The 20 percent discount goes into effect on the first day of the 2005-2006 ski season. The discount is not applicable on the pre-sale of season passes or school programs. Regular package rates still apply. A valid proof of photo identification is required to receive the discount upon purchase. The purchaser's primary residence must be located in Lackawanna County.
