## So Much PAPER to Recycle *Here's WHAT and HOW:*

Please keep it separated in a brown paper bag or bundle.  
**NOTHING ELSE IN THIS BAG.**



### Mixed Paper

Magazines, catalogs, office paper, mail, envelopes, light weight boxes (cereal and crackers- please throw out liners and paper towel rolls and pizza boxes **ALL TOGETHER in another paper bag.**



### Cardboard boxes

heavy shipping boxes  
Please **FLATTEN** and bundle.



## How To Prepare Recyclables

1. Remove food/drink waste and liners from boxes.

2. Flattening plastic bottles & then putting caps back on will make more room.



3. Please don't break glass! It's hard to recycle.

4. Put shredded paper in a clear plastic bag so it can be easily recycled.

### HELPFUL TIP:

Plastic bags cannot be put in your recycling bin. Please, return them to the grocery store or purchase reusable bags.

## Comingle Containers Cans, Bottles, Jars, Tubs & Tops

### Glass

Bottles & Jars only

These tops should be thrown away.

**NO windows, mugs or glasses etc.**

### Cans

Aluminum & Steel (Tin)

Beverage & Food containers

### Plastic

**Bottles, Jars & Tubs with tops:**

Milk, soda, water, soaps, margarine,

yogurt, cottage cheese etc.

**NO cups, toys, plant pots...**



**The following cannot be recycled:**  
Food wrappers, paper or foam dishes/cups, snack bags, straws, utensils,, wraps, film.
