## Agenda:

Day 1 - Students will be educated on public art projects and learn about modern artists currently creating this art form. Techniques and practices will be instructed.

Day 2- Assignment, break up into 3 groups and each group will design a permanent installation, ceiling hanging sculpture to be housed inside the gallery at New Visions. Students will use knowledge learned during instruction to design a project that will work within the space provided, keeping materials provided in mind.
