Why Raise Taxes?

From 2004-2007, the Cordaro-Munchak Administration borrowed \$118 million and placed taxpayer funds into SWAPS, which resulted in increased debt service and SWAP termination fees totaling \$14.3 million.

The County has lost \$4.4 million in federal and state assistance dollars in the past year. \$3 million was lost in federal prisoner revenue due to a reduction in INS prisoners in Pennsylvania, a \$1 million loss in emergency services and \$400,000 in human services.

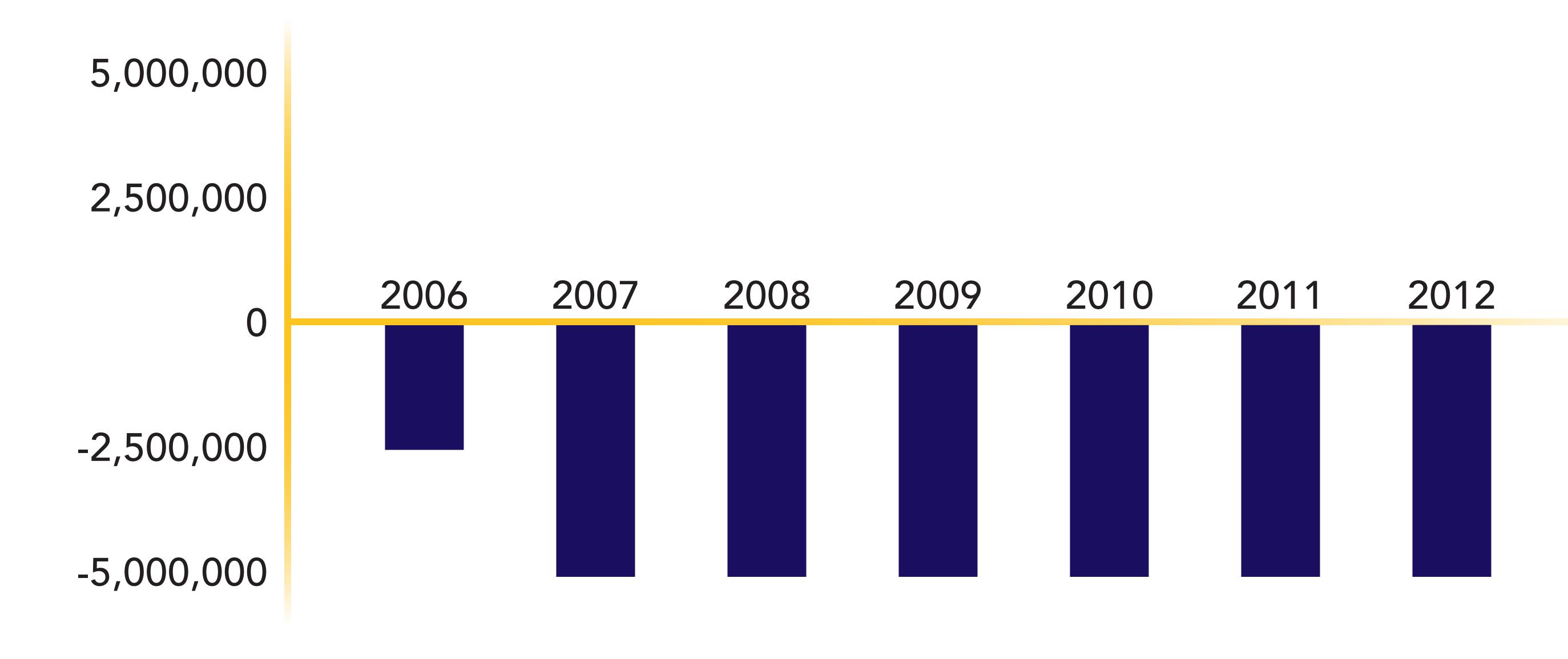

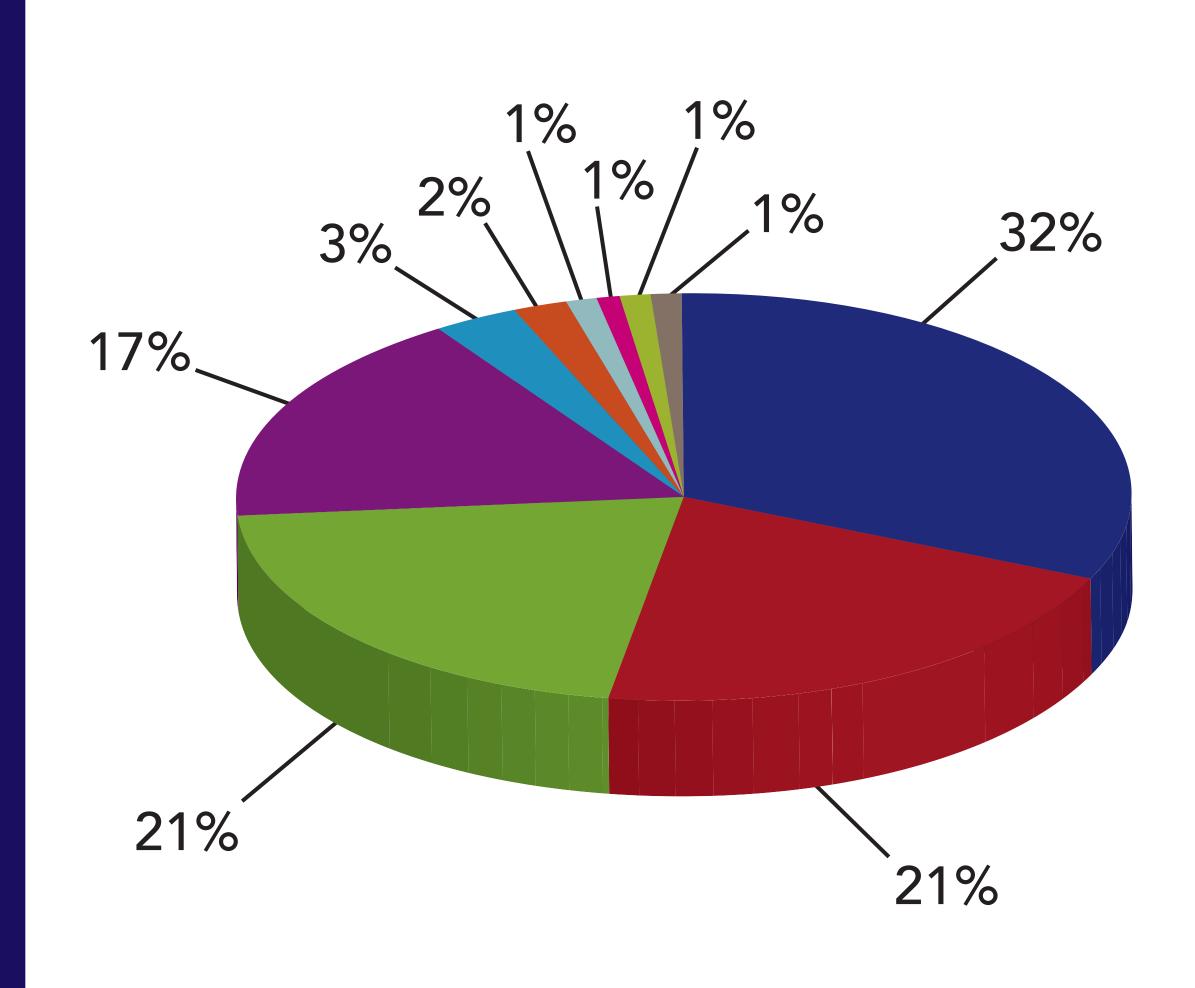
