PennDOT Issues a Tier 4 Restriction on Interstate 81 from I-84 in Dunmore to New York Border

Dunmore, PA – Due to the winter storm impacting the region, PennDOT has issued a tier 4 restriction on interstate 81 from Dunmore at (I-84) in Lackawanna County to the New York border in Susquehanna County beginning at 10:30 AM.

A Tier 4 restriction bans ALL COMMERCIAL VEHICLES from the interstates. PennDOT encourages motorists to avoid unnecessary travel.

Although PennDOT has crews treating roadways around the clock, the department's primary goal is to keep roads passable, not completely free of ice and snow. PennDOT will continue to treat roadways throughout the storm until precipitation stops and roads are clear.

In addition, PennDOT reminds motorists to pack an emergency kit for their vehicles. A basic kit should include non-perishable food, water, blanket, small shovel and warm clothes. When preparing an emergency kit, motorists should take into account special needs of passengers such as baby food, pet supplies or medications and pack accordingly.

To help make decisions regarding winter travel, motorists are encouraged to "Know Before You Go" by checking conditions on more than 40,000 roadway miles, including color-coded winter conditions on 2,900 miles, by visitingwww.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information and access to more than 1,000 traffic cameras. Users can also see plow truck statuses and travel alerts along a specific route using the "Check My Route" tool.

511PA is also available through a smartphone application for iPhone and Android devices, by calling 5-1-1, or by following regional Twitter alerts accessible on the 511PA website.
